

Separate first

Recyclable waste salable staff, paper, recyclable plastic, glass, metal can, etc. Put into yellow bag or tie bag with **yellow** ribbon or rope then place at the collection point for the collection by appointment.



Organic waste vegetable scraps, food waste, leaves and branches, etc. Make a compost in the tray or basket, or make Bio-extracts, Biogas, animal feed but unavailable section is **littered as general waste**.



Hazardous waste chemical container, battery, mobile phone battery, light bulb, expired medicine, expired cosmetic. Put into orange bag or tie bag with **orange** ribbon or rope then place at the collection point for the collection by appointment.



General waste non-recyclable plastic, packaging, rubber, rag, paper, unsalable plastic, foam, surplus vegetable waste. **Put into bag and tie with ribbon or rope** then place at the collection point for the collection by appointment.

Waste in bag or container

(Ministerial Regulation on Hygienic Waste Management B.E.2560) (2017)

- **Waste separation** separate 2 types of waste (recyclable waste and hazardous waste) from general waste.
- **Waste bag** made from plastic or materials which is sticky, durable, unleaky and properly sized plastic.
- **Waste container** made from easily cleaned, durable, unleaky and movable material covered with tight lid for pest control and always clean-up.

No littering! People who litters in public places must be fined

- **Act on the Maintenance of the Cleanliness and Orderliness of the Country, B.E. 2560 (2017)**
Littering waste to public areas shall be subject to a fine not exceeding 2,000 baht.
Littering waste into river or canal areas shall be subject to a fine not exceeding 10,000 baht.
- **Highway Act, B.E. 2535 (1992)**
Littering waste or sewage to road or pavement shall be subject to a fine not exceeding 60,000 baht or imprisonment not exceeding 3 years.



Littering waste into river or canal areas shall be subject to a fine not exceeding **10,000 baht.**

General waste

Marking
ties bag with orange ribbon or rope or put into orange bag especially for hazardous waste

Separated waste before collection to treatment or disposal system.

General waste
non-recyclable plastic, packet, foam, packaging, diaper, etc.

Tie bag carefully and place at the collection point for the collection by appointment.

Occasional collection

Collecting from request

Large amount of waste separation.
Request service to District Offices.
Pay collection fee each time.



Bulky waste mattress, table, cabinet, wood, bed, electrical appliance, sofa, chair, etc.

- Request service to District Offices.
- District offices appoint to collect bulky waste (no collection fee).



Large amount of branches Request service to District Offices for collecting service.



Construction and demolition waste
stone, cement, concrete, ceiling board, etc.
